Electronic Travel Authority (subclass 601) visa conditions

Business visitor activity (visa condition 8115)

It is illegal to work on an Electronic Travel Authority. Whilst on an Electronic Travel Authority you have no right to work in Australia. You may only undertake business visitor activities such as the undertaking of business enquiries and contractual negotiations or attending conferences.

Maximum three months study (visa condition 8201)

You must not study for more than three months.

Tuberculosis free (visa condition 8527)

You must be free from tuberculosis at the time of travel to, and entry into, Australia.

No criminal conviction (visa condition 8528)

You must not have any criminal convictions for which you have been sentenced for a total combined period of 12 months or more (whether or not you served the sentence/s), at the time of travel to, and entry into, Australia.

Information pack on domestic and family violence, sexual assault and forced marriage

The Australian Government has developed a family safety pack with information on Australia's laws regarding domestic and family violence, sexual assault and forced marriage. The family safety pack also includes important information about the essential services and emergency contacts in Australia. This information can be found at www.dss.gov.au/familysafetypack.

Character requirements

Entering or remaining in Australia is a privilege. You must obey the law and not engage in criminal activity.

Your visa may be cancelled for a number of reasons, including if you have a substantial criminal record or behave in a way that is a risk to somebody in the Australian community.

What you can do on an ETA

You can stay in Australia for up to 3 months on each entry. You can't work in Australia.

If you stay in Australia for long periods or make frequent visits to Australia, we may ask you about your travel purpose next time you enter Australia.

If you are found not to be a genuine visitor, or you breach your visa conditions, your ETA may be cancelled. You may be removed or refused entry to Australia.
